12 Eleanor, FDR

Lights shift back to FDR and ELEANOR for the remainder of the scene.

ELEANOR

Franklin, what the hell was that!?

FDR

It can't be Upton Sinclair, Eleanor.

ELEANOR

Bullshit!

FDR

Look, I don't like Frank Merriam either, but what's done is done. And that's the end of it.

ELEANOR

I wasn't aware I had married a coward. Well, if you're not brave enough to endorse Upton, I will!

NO YOU WILL NOT!

This eruption stops her cold.

FDR

You will not endorse Upton Sinclair. I have worked too hard for too long for some socialist prick to de-rail the New Deal and everything I have done for this country.

ELEANOR

Ha! You're scared of him, aren't
you?

FDR

I'm not scared of anyone.

ELEANOR

You know, I couldn't figure out why the hell Merriam would support the New Deal. But now it's all coming together. You're thinking about '36, aren't you? You think Sinclair could run and beat you.

FDR

Believe whatever your little heart desires, but you must promise me you will not endorse Upton Sinclair. Eleanor!

ELEANOR

...fine. I promise.

ELEANOR turns to leave.

FDR

Where are you going?

ELEANOR

I'm going to get some tea. Maybe a doughnut. Or do I need your permission to do that now, too?

ELEANOR stares him down and then exits without another word. FDR sits in silence for a moment, unsure of the decision he has made. We move to:
